What is Mentoring?

Mentoring is an opportunity to empower youth in our community to make positive life choices that enable them to maximize their potential!

Youth mentoring is the process of matching mentors with young people who need or want a caring, responsible adult in their lives.

The goal of youth mentoring programs is to improve the well-being of the child by providing a positive role model that can support the child academically, socially and/or personally.

Statistics prove that school-based mentoring increases student engagement, attendance, peer relations and attitudes. The school-based approach reveals improvement in the classroom and socially. Mentors from the community are matched with a student and they work one on one throughout the school year. As a mentor, the expectation is to be a friend and positive role model that is supportive and encouraging. This relationship will help motivate the student, known as the mentee, to be successful in school, community and life.
